



A New Song



Psalm 96 begins this way:

O sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth.

Sing a <u>new</u> song to God, the psalmist tells us – not the same old song one more time around. As old as the scriptures are, they are always about new beginnings and fresh starts. When, generation after generation, the people of Israel couldn't get their side of the covenant with God right, God's response was "I will make a new covenant, ... and I will write it on their hearts" (Jeremiah 31). And Isaiah tells us that God says,

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.

God is always doing something new, and God invites <u>us</u> to go in new directions, too. **On February 1, we will gather in retreat to chart a new course for the future. I wonder - what new song will we sing with God?** Will we choose a new mission focus? Will we imagine new programs for our growing children? Will we come up with new ways to use our building and grounds? Will we find new ways to worship God together?

It is a new year and time for a new song. Let all the earth sing to the Lord!

Property Group News

The Property Group has been working for awhile to get the necessary jobs done in the church and on the grounds. We meet as needed, approximately monthly, for breakfast at the Center Harbor Diner or Village Kitchen and then go over the work that needs to be done and parcel it out as people are able to do it. If you would be willing to help, please let Louisa or I know and I will make sure you get an invitation to the next get together. Even if you can't make the meetings but are willing to help with some of the tasks that come up, let me know and I will add you to our "call list".

As of January, Dave Ostroth's term as Trustee is ending and he will no longer be leading the Property Group. I (Jeff) have agreed to act as coordinator/manager going forward. If there are any property issues, please send an email or call me. Emails are best because I can capture any information easily and reliably. If you call and I can't write things down, it's harder to make sure things are dealt with properly. Obviously, sometimes calls are necessary.

One issue that needs a volunteer, starting in January, is garbage collection. Every two weeks we need to collect garbage in the church and Gilpatric Hall, place it in the Casella cart outside, and roll the cart to the curb for pickup on Monday. I can return the cart on Tuesday when I pick up my mail, but I am a bit busy already on Sundays to deal with the collection process. So, we are looking for a volunteer to take on this task. If you can't do it every other Sunday, you can ask someone else to cover for you. Thank you for your consideration.

January Mission of the Month: Christmas Fund Veterans of the Cross



It may seem strange to have "The Christmas Fund" as our January mission of the month. It's because the money we offer NOW is used during the whole year and also to wish retired clergy a "Merry Christmas" NEXT year. This year's theme is:

"And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them..." (Luke 2:9)

The Christmas Fund is one of the national UCC's four special mission offerings. The Christmas Fund has been caring for active and retired clergy and lay employees of the United Church of Christ for over 100 years. It provides emergency grants, supplements small annuities and health premiums, and sends Christmas "Thank You" gift checks each December to our lower-income retirees.

UCC congregations and members have blessed the Christmas Fund with their generosity for many years. This year, your care and compassion will be especially appreciated by those servants of the church who are facing a time of need. This offering is managed by the Pension Boards.

During 2024, the members and friends of Center Harbor Congregational Church gave **\$9,871** to the different monthly missions and Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM is the over-arching offering that makes all other national offerings operate). **THAT IS AMAZING!**

But wait! There's MORE! Because of the generosity and foresight of Gertrude Matthes, the Matthes Fund was set up decades ago to proportionally augment our annual mission giving.

a 3 day a week 5 hour a day program. We place an emphasis on learning about the natural world and the environ-

This month we will be immersed in learning about hibernation, migration and adaption, animal tracks out in the meadow, and the animals who make those tracks.
